"The feedback we received at yesterday's meeting will be invaluable as Council further deliberates the issues," said Springwater Township Mayor Tony Guergis. "The next step will be to refine the Township's understanding of the needs of residents as it relates to the by-laws. The Public Meeting is not the last step in the development of very complex by-laws, but the first step in public consultation."
