Winter Operations in Springwater



The Township maintains 864 lane km of road and 45 km of sidewalk. Clearance is prioritized based on road classification, speed and traffic volumes and adheres to Minimum Maintenance Standards set out in the Municipal Act. Springwater does not have any MM1 or MM2 classified roads.

Road Classification	Salting/Sanding	Plowing
MM3 (Major collectors /bus routes)	Within 8 hours of becoming aware of icy conditions.	When snow/slush reaches a depth of 8 cm, within 12 hours of becoming aware of accumulation.
MM4 (residential streets)	Within 12 hours of becoming aware of icy conditions.	When snow/slush reaches a depth of 8 cm, within 16 hours of becoming aware of accumulation.
MM5 (cul-de-sac / minor residential)	Within 16 hours of becoming aware of icy conditions.	When snow/slush reaches a depth of 10 cm, within 24 hours of becoming aware of accumulation.
MM6 (low traffic volume, dead-end roads)	No standards set out in the Minimum Maintenance Standards.	No standards set out in the Minimum Maintenance Standards.

Track the Plow

The Township has an interactive tool that allows residents to track the progress of our winter maintenance vehicles. Visit springwater.ca/SnowPlowTracker to see which municipal roads and sidewalks have been cleared within the past 1, 4, 12 and 16 hours.

Winter Parking Restrictions

Remember that winter parking restrictions are in effect until March 31. To aid snow removal in Springwater, please avoid parking on Township roads and in municipal parking lots between 2:00 a.m. and 7:00 a.m. Additionally, please remove bins, planters and basketball nets from the end of your driveway.

Did you know?

- Visibility is **significantly reduced** in a plow -- give them plenty of space!
- Springwater **does not** have staff on duty 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
- Patrollers inspect road conditions on a daily basis during the winter.
- All winter maintenance vehicles are equipped with **GPS**.
- The average plow route takes **5 to 6 hours**.
