
Mayoral Decision**MD-2025-007****A decision to Veto a by-law passed by Council – By-law 2025-094, in part as it applies to Resolution C458-2025**

Whereas the Mayor has the authority to exercise certain powers under Part VI.1 (Special Powers and Duties of Head of Council) of the Municipal Act, 2001 (“Act”); and

Whereas section 284.11 of the Act provides that if the head of council is of the opinion that all or part of a by-law could potentially interfere with a prescribed provincial priority, the head of council may veto the by-law; and

Whereas the Province has prescribed provincial priorities by making O. Reg. 580/22: Provincial Priorities pursuant to section 284.9 of the Act; and

Whereas the Mayor of the Township of Springwater deems it desirable to exercise decision-making power under the Act; and

Whereas on November 5, 2025, the Mayor exercised their authority under section 284.11.1 of the Act to propose a by-law to Council to authorize the execution and delivery of an agreement related to the boundary adjustment/restructuring proposal between the Township and the City of Barrie based on their opinion that the by-law could potentially advance a provincial priority, and Council enacted By-law 2025-093 in accordance with subsection 284.11.1(4) of the Act and to take primacy over any other resolutions; and

Whereas on November 7, 2025, the Mayor issued Mayoral Decision 2025-005 to Veto By-law 2025-091, in part, as it applies to resolution C446-2025 that purported to direct Loopstra Nixon LLP to commence legal proceedings challenging the use of the Mayor’s exercise of powers under Part VI.1 of the Act in relation to the boundary adjustment/restructuring proposal, which in the opinion of the Mayor could potentially interfere with the provincial priorities set out section 1 of O. Reg. 580/22; and,

Whereas on November 12, 2025, the Mayor issued Mayoral Decision 2025-006 to Veto By-law 2025-095, in part, as it applies to resolution C452-2025 that purported to direct Loopstra Nixon LLP to commence legal proceedings challenging the use of the Mayor’s exercise of powers under Part VI.1 of the Act in relation to the boundary adjustment/restructuring proposal, which in the opinion of the Mayor could potentially interfere with the provincial priorities set out section 1 of O. Reg. 580/22; and,

Whereas the Mayor reaffirms their opinion on the matter.

Now therefore the Mayor of the Township of Springwater hereby exercises the authority pursuant to subsection 284.11(5) of the Act to veto the following by-law passed by Council on November 12, 2025 as follows:

1. That By-law 2025-094, being a by-law to confirm the proceedings of the Township of Springwater at its meeting held on November 12, 2025 be vetoed, in part, as it applies to resolution C458-2025 to oppose the City of Barrie Boundary Adjustment proposal and to direct Loopstra Nixon LLP to proceed with legal proceedings, despite previous Mayoral Directions (hereinafter referred to as the “By-law”).
2. That all other aspects of By-law 2025-094 shall be deemed to have been approved in writing pursuant to subclause 284.11(4)(a)(i) of the Act on November 13, 2025.

The reasons for the veto are as follows:

I, Jennifer Coughlin, Mayor of the Township of Springwater am of the opinion that the By-law could potentially interfere with the provincial priorities set out in section 1 of O. Reg. 580/22.

In particular, Council’s decision to continue to challenge the exercise of powers under Part VI.1 of the Act seeking to potentially advance provincial priorities, to obtain injunctive relief in relation thereto and to request a judicial inquiry respecting the lawful and good faith exercise of said powers constitutes a potential interference with prescribed provincial priorities.

This mayoral decision shall come into effect this 13th day of November, 2025.
